









Weight on total international publications






% of Chinese authors in «Chinese» journals (in WoS)













Publications in the health sector on total publications




Fields in Wos funded by NSFC

% of publications in the health sector in international networks (with foreign authors)



METHODOLOGY

- I. Selection of WoS publications health-China 2018 and 2021 (84 fields);
- 2. Identification of keyworks related to COVID-19;
- 3. Selection of the first 5 health sectors according to COVID-related articles in 2021;
- 4. Selection of the last 5 health sectors according to COVID-related articles in 2021;
- 5. Download of Wos publications related to the sectors identified at points 3 and 4 (+2018 for comparison);
- 6. Identification of the involved countries for each of the selected publications;
- 7. Social network analysis only on international co-publications for the 6 sub-sets (2018 top and last, 2021 top and last, 2021 top COVID, 2021 top no COVID);


% COVID publications on total health













FIRST INSIGHTS

- Between 2018 and 2021:
 - There are more bilateral relations with China and a less central role of USA;
 - There is a decrease in the network density, but only in the «last 5»;
 - The steady density in the «top 5» in 2021 in comparison with 2018 is, however, mainly due to non-COVID publications.
- Already from this preliminary analysis a different structure of transnational scientific collaborations seems to emerge as regards publications related to COVID-19. The international networks of COVID publications are, in fact, smaller and involve a lower number of countries. Furthermore, in such networks China has a central position, and USA a more marginal role.

FUTURE RESEARCH LINES

- To identify possible motivations of the «scientific closure» of China regarding COVID-related research;
- To refine the methodology in order to evaluate the statistical significance of differences;
- To introduce international comparisons;
- To analyse the COVID-related publications in Chinese / in China;
- To analyse the relation with policy measures.
