Registration

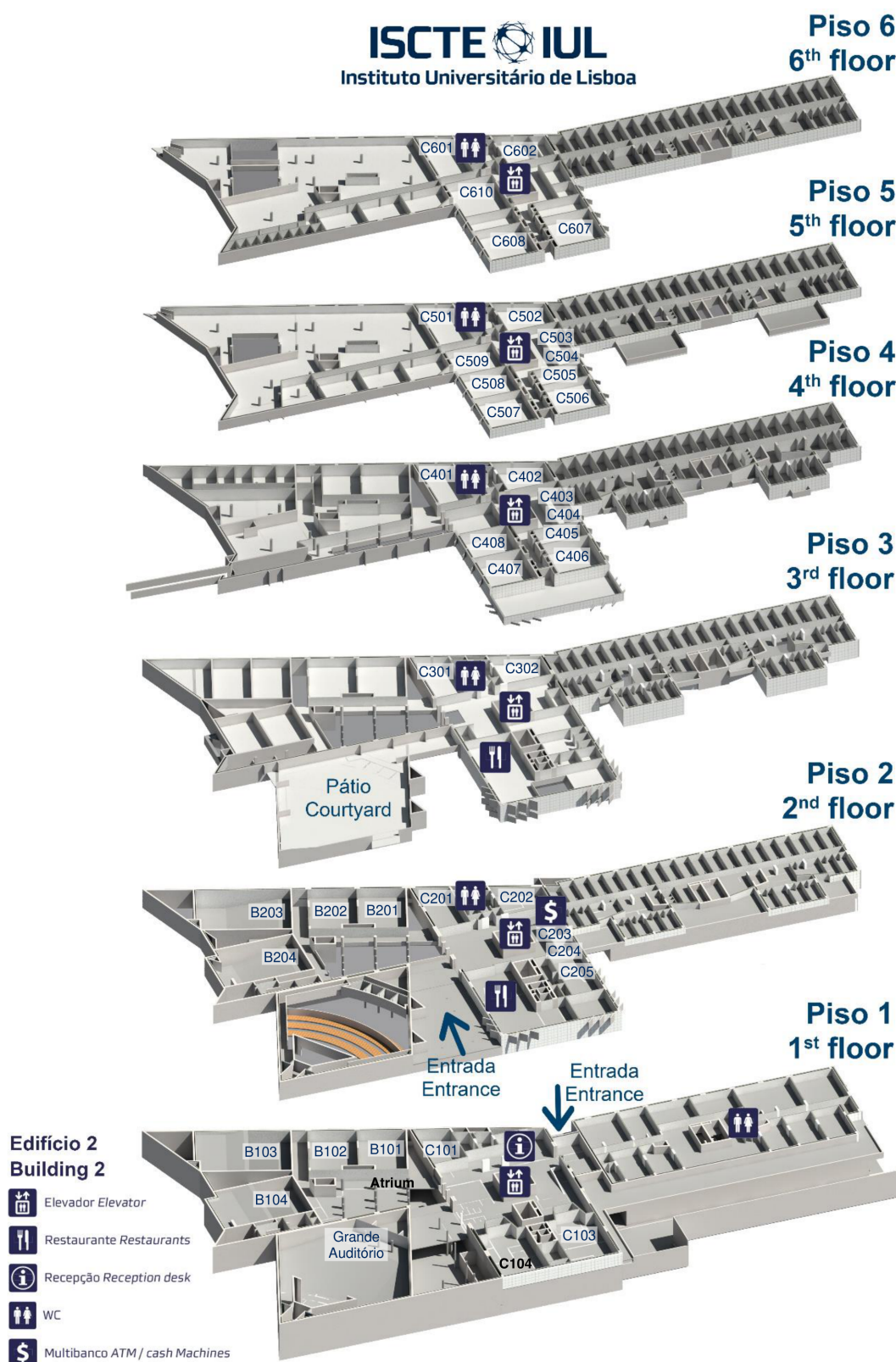

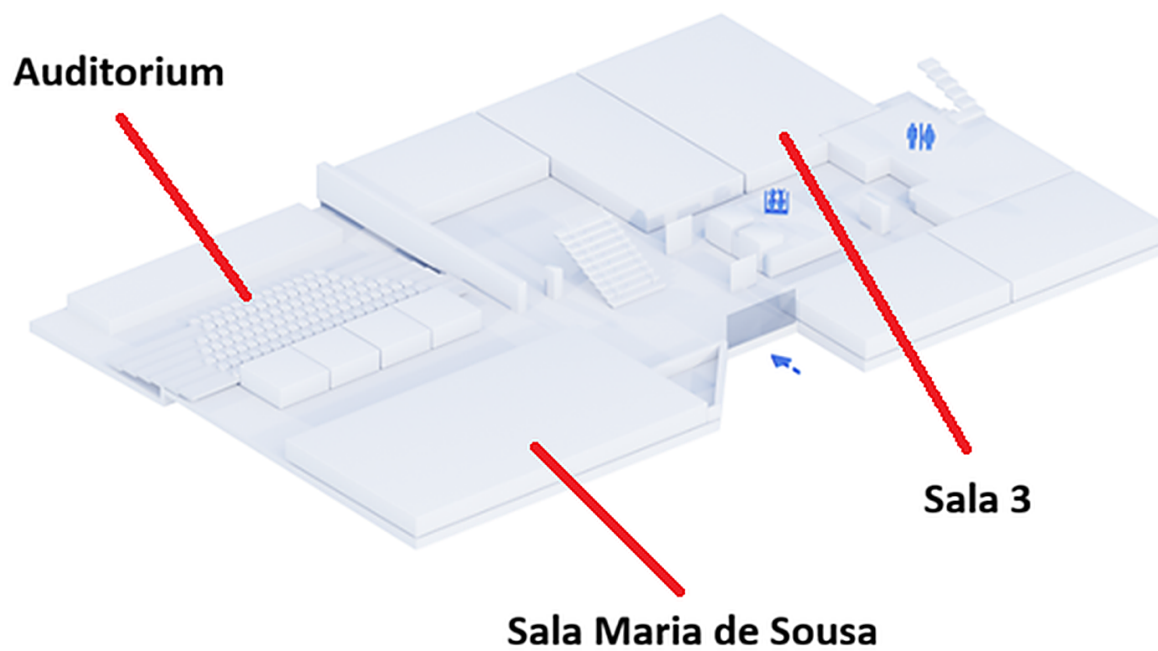

Edifício II — main building (all session rooms)



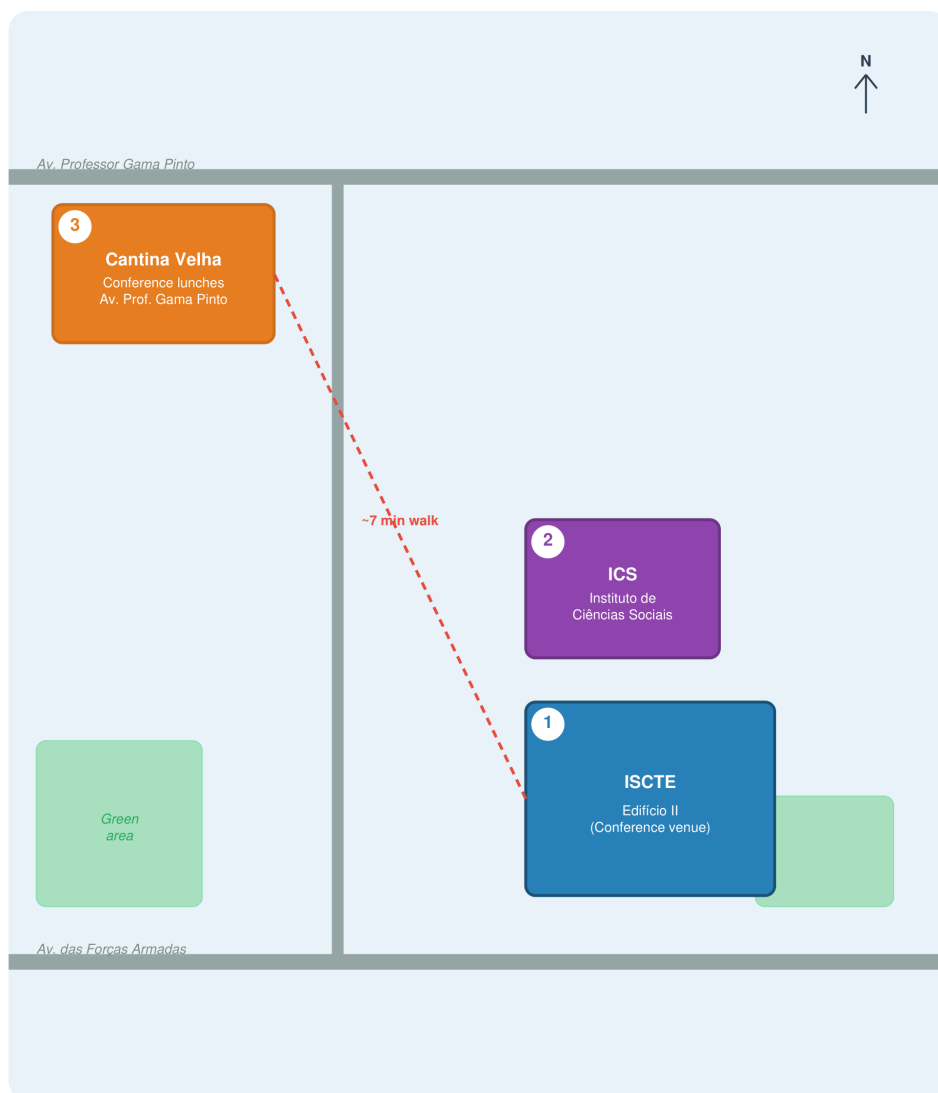
ICS building — the three ICS rooms
